

## First PULSION CME e-learning course

### First Pulsion CME e-learning course – more to follow!

PULSION's first public CME certified e-learning course for medical staff in Germany has now been online since June 2016. The course, entitled "Advanced hemodynamic monitoring in cardiac risk patients", is available on one of Germany's leading e-learning platforms for doctors, [cme.medlearning.de](http://cme.medlearning.de). The course content discusses minimal-invasive technology and guidelines for preoperative risk stratification, amongst others. Within the first half year, over 1500 visitors have been to the page and more than 200 doctors successfully passed the final test. The statistics also show that we are reaching doctors in Germany's largest cities: regarding page visits, the top five cities include Munich, Berlin, Dusseldorf and Stuttgart. This is a fantastic result, which has encouraged us to develop more public e-learning content.

### CME is required by German law

In Germany, doctors are by law required to take part in Continuing Medical Education (CME), and must collect a total of 250 CME-points within a 5-year-period. The Bavarian State Chamber of Physicians has certified PULSION's course, so doctors will receive 2 CME points for completing the 45-minute course and passing a final test with 10 questions. They then receive an advanced training certificate and their CME-points are automatically registered with the German Medical Association.

### PULSION developing more CME e-learning courses

The course content was developed by Dr. Sebastian A. Haas from the Center for Anesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine at Germany's famous University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE) in cooperation with the PULSION training department. It will be available online until 1 June 2017. Further courses on different topics are planned, and we hope that other countries will follow Germany's lead and develop content for their local public e-learning platforms.
